World-Traveled Teacher

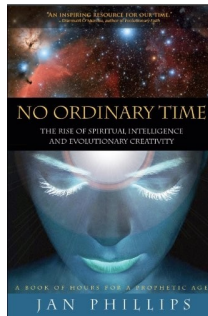
